

Adding Alt Text to Social Media posts



Alternative text (alt text) is a brief description of an image that is read aloud by screen readers for users who are visually impaired.

Make sure to include alt text for all images in your social media posts, including memes and GIFs. You can add these to the end of the post, or to the image itself, or both. See pages 3-6 for instructions on how to add/embed alt text to images in different platforms.

Writing Alt text

Try to imagine how you would describe the image to a person. Consider language and be sure to add any context, for example a cosy cottage in a forest, versus a cabin in the woods. Both are similar things but have very different connotations.



Adding Alt text to the end of your post

Adding an Image Description (ID) at the end of your post is an easy way to make your posts accessible. Ideally it is the last thing in the post and encapsulated with the [] Characters and Image Description or ID.

Example Order












Image Description





Adding Alt text to Meta Business suite



The meta business suite is great for posting both Insta and Facebook content at the same time. Once you have selected your image to upload, you can select the edit button and choose alt text








Once you have selected your image to upload, the option to add alt text appears at the bottom



Click Alt Text


Enter your alt text and click save before selecting "done"


